Building the Confidence to Succeed: Kaleb Lawson and Fred Barson

At first glance, Fred Barson and Kaleb Lawson seem to come from two completely different worlds: one a 68-year-old white marketing consultant from San Rafael, the other a young African-American from Marin City who sometimes struggled to find his place in high school. But the unique relationship the two formed through Marin Education Fund has launched Kaleb on the path to success, helping him to achieve his goal of a college degree.

In high school, Kaleb always dreamed of working in education. He earned good grades at the Marin School of Arts and Technology, worked at a youth center and got involved in environmental activism. Yet college still seemed like a distant fantasy. Few of his friends planned to attend. His mother Rachelle, who works for the Marin Housing Authority, was fiercely supportive but hadn't gone to college herself and knew little about the application process. Kaleb played with the idea of community college, but assumed a four-year school was out of reach.

"I didn't think I could get in, and if I got in I didn't think I could afford it," he says.

90% of Marin Education Fund students graduate from college, compared to the national average of 58%



All that changed when Kaleb attended Marin Education Fund's Summer Application Institute and was matched with his mentor, Fred.

Fred's first impression of Kaleb was of a tall, shy 16-year-old who was smart and dedicated but lacked information about the college application process and needed a boost in self-esteem. "Kaleb just needed to believe in himself," says Fred, who joined Marin Education Fund as a way to give back to his community. "I kept telling him he could do it and he kept saying OK and came back with higher goals every time I saw him."

Together the two made a list of schools that Kaleb would target. Fred, a former writing instructor, helped Kaleb develop his application essay. Kaleb was soon accepted to St. Mary's, his first choice. A scholarship from Marin Education Fund helps pay his tuition.

"Fred and the other people at Marin Education Fund boosted my confidence

and showed me I shouldn't settle for less," he says. "The things they taught me about financial aid and how to navigate school, I still take with me every day."

A sociology major, Kaleb also works in his school's admissions office, doing outreach to other minority students. After

graduation, he hopes to attend law school and work in education policy. "Kids have to go to college to move up in society," he says. "I want to help change the system so that goal is more attainable for low income and first generation students."

For Fred, Kaleb's story is a perfect example of the lasting impact

Marin Education Fund has on the local community, and the power of our belief that everyone should have a chance at college. "Here is a guy who has a tremendous social conscience and is already using what he has learned to help other students like him," he says. "What more could we ask for?"

A Proven Model for College Success

- **College Bound** takes middle-schoolers to college with day tours to Bay Area campuses.
- **The Summer Application Institute** allows 50-60 students each year to live in a dorm on the Dominican University campus, taking workshops on everything from taking the SATs to how to file for financial aid.
- **Mentors** pair with students in their senior year of high school, helping them and their families navigate the college application process, financial aid, and surviving the first year of college.
- **553 students** received scholarships in 2008 from Marin Education Fund for use this fall.
- On average, **over \$13,000** in additional scholarship support is leveraged for each student who receives a Marin Education Fund scholarship.

Ways to Give

Since 1981, donors to Marin Education Fund have helped provide college access programs, scholarships, and support to students of all ages who are in need. The low-income and traditionally underrepresented students who receive support from Marin Education Fund are frequently the first generation of their family to go to college. Here are a few ways to make a gift.



THE OPPORTUNITY FUND

Gifts to the Opportunity Fund annual campaign are awarded as scholarships in the same year they are given. Donors can make gifts by check, credit card, or by donating securities. All donors are recognized in the Annual Report.

Beginning in 2009, donors of \$150 or more will be recognized in the annual report as members of The Friends of Marin Education Fund.

THE LAUREL SCHOLARSHIP SOCIETY

Membership in The Laurel Scholarship Society is contingent on a commitment of \$5,000 or more per year for four years. Each year, the gift is awarded as a scholarship to one or two students. The four-year commitment guarantees that a student will have funding for his or her entire college career, if all academic conditions are met.

CASH

For many donors, this is the simplest way to donate. Cash gifts provide a charitable deduction in the year they are given. They can be made as one-time contributions or in installments as payments toward a pledge. Cash gifts can be paid via check or credit card, and can also be made by going to our website, www.MarinEducationFund.org, and clicking on “Donate Now.”

GIFTS OF STOCK

A gift of appreciated securities entitles you to a charitable deduction equal to the fair market value of the securities without paying tax on the securities’ appreciation. To make a gift of stock, please contact the Director of Development at (415) 451-4009.

MATCHING GIFTS

Many companies offer matching gifts to their employees’ donations. Ask your company’s personnel office for more information on directing a matching gift to Marin Education Fund.

PLANNED GIFTS

Planned gifts from donors’ wills and trusts can provide a current charitable deduction in addition to income for your lifetime. The income can be distributed to you, the donor, your spouse or other designee, after which the assets would be distributed to the Marin Education Fund. Institutions can achieve stability and growth through planned giving. Contact your tax advisor for specific information that relates to your particular circumstances.

LIFE INSURANCE

A gift of a paid-up life insurance policy can provide a tax deduction to the donor and a significant gift to the Marin Education Fund. Life insurance premiums are tax deductible if the Marin Education Fund is designated as the owner and the beneficiary of the policy.

GIFTS IN KIND

Marin Education Fund welcomes donations such as computers, graphing calculators, classroom supplies, and other items related to our programs. The Development Office will be happy to help you determine the acceptability of gifts. Gift value will be determined by the donor through appraisal or record of purchase. Marin Education Fund does not assign value to used items.

MULTI-YEAR PLEDGES FOR MAJOR GIFTS

Pledges can be paid over several years. In other words, a donor can pledge a gift in one year, but can take several years to complete the fulfillment of that pledge.

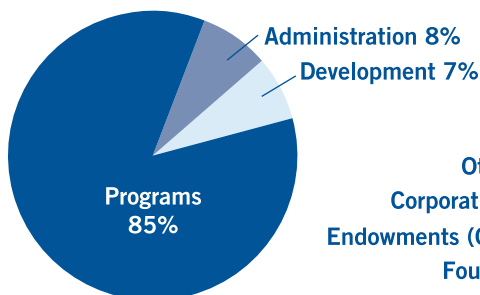

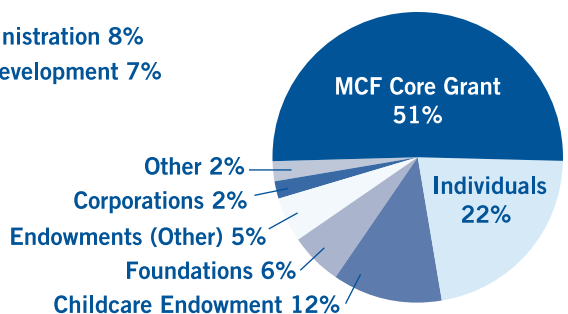
